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ADMINISTRATOR'S STATEMENT

The Board of Regents of Cisco College is composed of nine members all of whom reside in Cisco and serve six-year terms. The members of the board and their ending term dates are as follows:

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN POLICY:

There are no significant changes in policy which impact this budget request.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN PROVISION OF SERVICE:

Cisco College continues our progression toward enhanced student success. Cisco College continues to excel in student success points. The college continues to lead important projects across our region and campus wide to improve the transfer process and create career pathways in workforce/technical, nursing, and allied health programs in response to the unique workforce development needs of the community and region. In addition, the college continues developing strong partnerships with business and industry leaders, Dyess Airforce Base Officials, hospital administrators, school districts, four-year universities, and local governmental groups across the region, which has produced grant funds for program enhancements, growth in the number of dual-credit school districts, increases in academic program pathways, and overall enrollment.

SIGNIFICANT EXTERNALITIES:

Improving completion rates is essential to region's economic development. As with many across the state, Cisco College faces challenges in changing the culture where high school drop-out rates are above the average. Cisco College has seen increases in enrollment and semester credit hour production, which is remarkable considering that unemployment rates are low (4.0%) and the economy is strong across the Big Country region. Unfortunately, a trained and skilled workforce is threatened by the high rate of individuals testing positive on drug screenings. Cisco College will undoubtedly see demand increase from unemployed workers needing retraining and from recent high school graduates who realize that gainful employment will now require a degree or certificate.

PURPOSE OF ANY NEW FUNDING BEING REQUESTED:

Cisco College respectfully supports the \$1.9 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter dated, July 24, 2018. The funding request is needed support from the State and will allow Cisco College to make the following investments:

- Expand dual credit course offerings and increase academic advising and financial aid outreach services to our high schools.
- Continue improvements in the guided pathways project to ensure that all degree programs have a multi-year "roadmap" to degree completion.
- Expand Pathways to Careers in Career and Technical programs.
- Expand nursing program to include an evening cohort for working adults in response to the regional shortage of nurses.
- Enhance online/distance education programs to include faculty development
- Continue enhancements in campus safety/security.

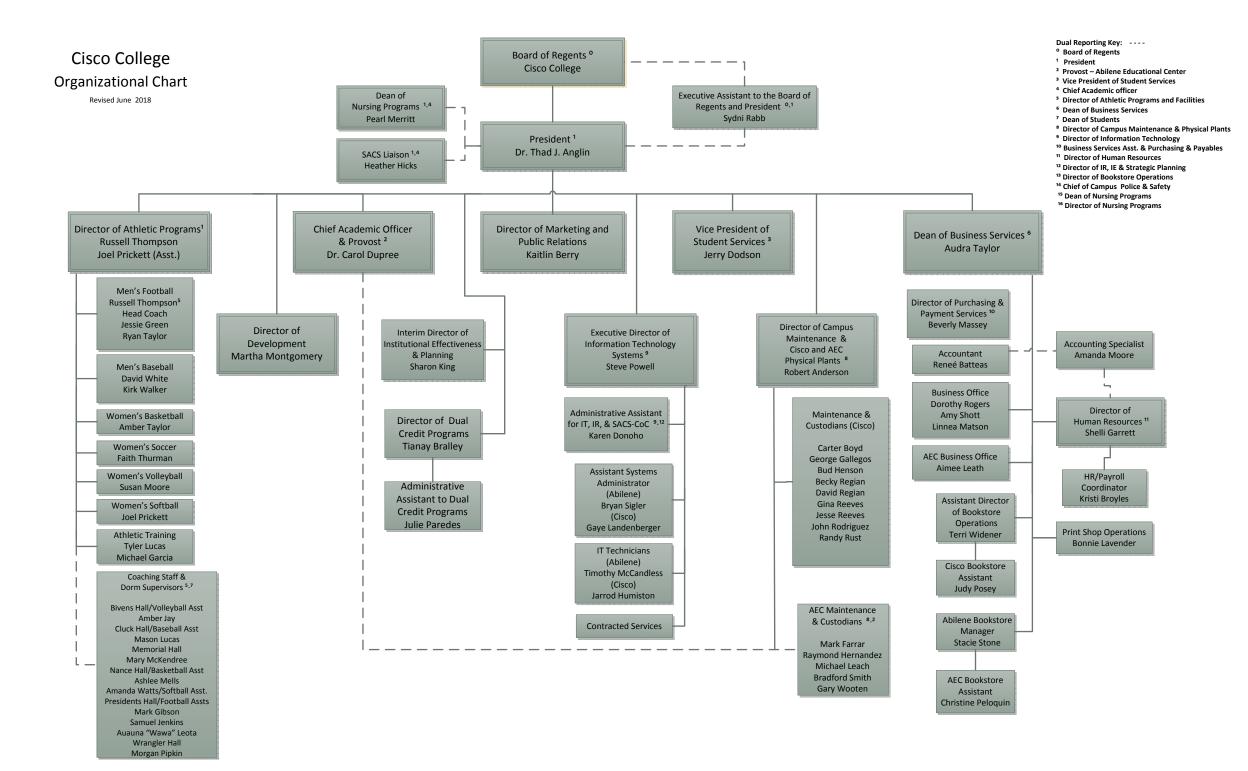

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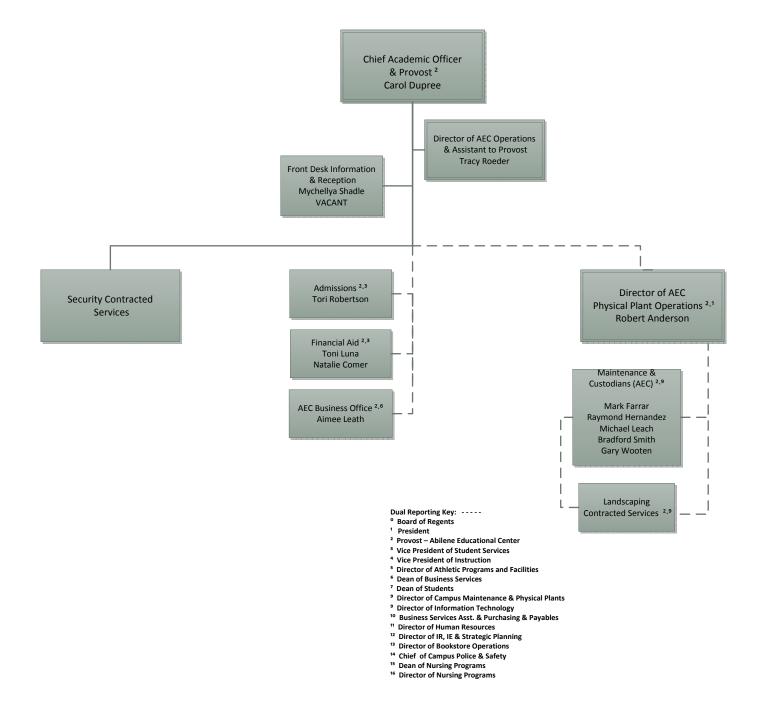

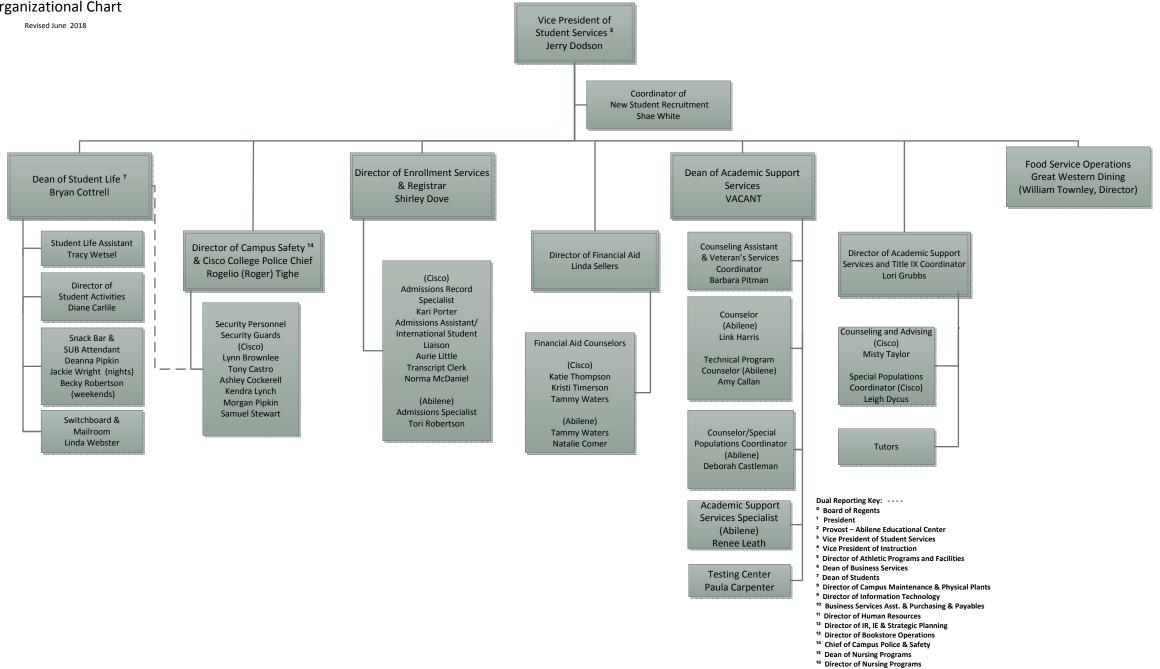


Cisco College Organizational Chart
