McMurry University will grant credit for courses completed at Cisco College as listed on the following Transfer Guides for the major in Human Health Science, together with the corresponding concentrations in Public Health & Wellness, Medical & Research, and Allied Health.

This agreement is in effect beginning with the fall 2020 semester, and will be updated as needed.

Please note that the following conditions apply:

- All requirements for admission to McMurry University must be met as outlined in the current catalog.
- A final official transcript from all previously attended schools must be submitted to McMurry University.
- A grade of 'C' or higher is required for any course transferred to McMurry. Transfer grades are not calculated in the McMurry GPA.
- Courses not accepted for transfer include, but not limited to, vocational, technical or Workforce Education Credit (WECM), developmental, or courses taken for pass/fail.
- No course taken at a junior or community college will be transferred as advanced credit hours.
- A maximum of 66 semester hours may be transferred from a junior or community college to McMurry.
