

Cisco College Board of Regents
Regular Board Meeting
September 15, 2025

The Cisco College Board of Regents met Monday, September 15, 2025, in the Board Room of the Regents' House on the college main campus in Cisco, Texas. Officers in attendance were President Brad Kimbrough, Vice President Rick Watts, and Secretary Ricky Whatley. Regents present were Jerry Conring and Greg Cary. Regents Kyle Wilks, Kenneth Preston, Jayln Johnson, and Staci Wilks were absent. College administrators present were Dr. Thad J. Anglin, President; Dr. Jerry Dodson, Vice President for Student Services and Athletic Director; Ms. Heather McClure, Vice President of Instruction; and Ms. Audra Taylor, Vice President of Business Services and Chief Financial Officer. Sydni Rabb, Executive Assistant, was present.

Guests present at the meeting included Dr. Helen Usera, Executive Director of Development and Grants; Dr. Tim Murphy, Executive Director of I.T.; Sheron Caton, Dean of Distance Education; William Vaughan, Executive Director of Institutional Effectiveness and Planning; Meredith Little, History/Government Professor and Faculty Senate President; and Tammy Starr, ERP Program Analyst.

Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America and the Texas Pledge of Allegiance.

Regent Greg Cary offered the invocation.

President Kimbrough called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

President Kimbrough asked for corrections or additions to the minutes of the regular meeting of August 18, 2025. There were none voiced and he declared the minutes approved as presented.

Chief Financial Officer and Vice President of Business Services, Audra Taylor, addressed the board members and stated there would be no August financial report since business personnel were in the process of closing out the month of August and the 2024-2025 fiscal year for the college, which ended August 31, 2025.

President Dr. Thad Anglin gave the fundraising report. This included: \$7,250.00 – Rodeo; \$31,117.47 – Football; \$190.00 – Cosmetology; \$3,440.00 – Baseball; \$120.00 – PTK; \$2,496.20 – Volleyball; and \$120.00 – Calculators. Donations: \$100 – in memory of Dr. Duane Hale. Grants received: \$82,630.00 – Anonymous – Dual Credit Access Grant for Non-FAST Taylor County Eligible Students.

Vice President for Student Services and Athletic Director, Dr. Jerry Dodson, gave the enrollment update. He stated the report contains the total enrollment and semester credit hours. There are currently 3,440 students enrolled in the fall 2025 semester and a total of 29,309 semester credit hours.

Dr. Dodson continued and addressed the board regarding the program count and residence halls and fall semester occupancy. There are a total of 343 beds and 283 are occupied. The numbers are indicated for each student, their assigned dorm and the activity in which they are involved. We currently have an 83% occupancy rate.

The Board of Regents of Cisco College has heretofore given public notices and conducted such votes as are necessary for the adoption of an ad valorem tax rate for the 2025-2026 tax year required by Chapter 26, of the Texas Property Tax Code; and they find it to be in the public

interest to adopt an ad valorem tax as described. The Cisco College Tax District shall impose an ad valorem tax of all taxable property within its boundaries of \$.2000 per \$100 of valuation of such property for the 2025-2026 tax year to be imposed pursuant to the terms and requirements of the Constitution of the State of Texas and the Texas Property Tax Code and said tax being so levied and apportioned to the specific purpose herein set forth. On a motion by Regent Greg Cary and a second by Regent Jerry Conring, the board voted to approve Resolution 2025-003, Resolution Adopting Tax Rate for 2025-2026, as presented. Motion passed 5 – 0, with Regents Kyle Wilks, Kenneth Preston, JayIn Johnson, and Staci Wilks absent.

Dr. Helen Usera, Executive Director of Development and Grants, gave an update on her department to the board. This included the Development Office, CC Foundation, Training, and Community Outreach.

The Annual Security and Fire Safety Report is published to provide information about services, programs, and statistical information in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Clery requires colleges and universities to: Publish an annual report every year by October 1 that contains three years of selected campus crime statistics and certain campus security policy statements; Disclose crime statistics for the campus, public areas immediately adjacent to or running through the campus, and certain non-campus facilities. The statistics must be gathered from campus police or security, local law enforcement, and other college officials who have significant responsibility for student and campus activities; Provide timely warning notices of those crimes that have occurred and pose an ongoing threat to students and employees; and disclose in a public crime log and crime that occurred on campus or within the patrol jurisdiction of the campus police or security department that is reported to the campus police or security department. Dr. Tim Murphy, Executive Director of I.T., gave a J1 update to the board. Dr. Murphy discussed the project and J1 implementation phases, gave an overview, key project milestones, and reviewed the go-live calendar with the board.

Dr. Anglin gave a Facilities and Maintenance Operations update to the board. This included gymnasium roof repairs; baseball pitching lab building; and there is a meeting scheduled with Gallager (building assessment Cisco and Abilene campuses).

Remarks from the Faculty Senate Representative, Meredith Little, there was no new business discussed at the last meeting held. Revisited items from last year – nurse coming on the campuses a few times during the week. Will have a shot clinic on both campuses next month – Cisco Campus – October 15th and Abilene Campus – October 14th. Have sent out the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation information to the faculty for their nominations.

Dr. Anglin announced there were no resignations, retirements, or terminations announced. Recommendation for full-time employment included Jennifer Brown, Dean of Students. There were no other personnel matters to be discussed. On a motion by Regent Rick Watts and a second by Regent Jerry Conring, the board voted to accept the recommendation of full-time employment, as presented. Motion passed 5 – 0, with Regents Kyle Wilks, Kenneth Preston, JayIn Johnson, and Staci Wilks absent.

Under Remarks by the President, Dr. Thad Anglin, October 3-4 – 7pm - Lone Star Regional College Rodeo – hosted by Cisco College at Taylo County Expo Center (invitation passed out);

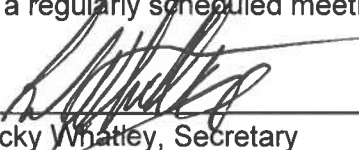

The next board meeting is October 20, 2025.

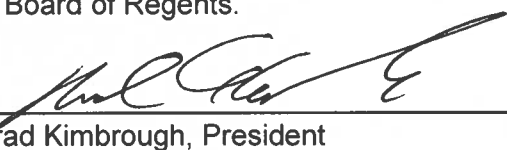
President Kimbrough entertained a motion to adjourn. Regents Conring and Watts obliged with a motion and second, respectively. Motion carried.
